LU Core Curriculum notes:

*LU prefers BIOL 2401 and 2402 Anatomy & Physiology I and II for L & PS core, PSYC 2301 General Psychology for Social & Behavioral Sciences core LU Major Specific Courses - Human Development and Family & Education: Students should consult an LU University Studies department advisor for list of approved courses relevant to each discipline.

LU Technical Credit Policy:

The University Studies program allows students to use technical credit to satisfy degree requirements under the following conditions:

- Technical credit may not be substituted for upper division courses.
- Technical credit must be from a regionally accredited institution.
- Technical credit must be applied en bloc to the relevant degree program.
- Students must have satisfactorily completed technical courses with at least a grade of C or demonstrated satisfactory performance.
- Students may not apply for credit for the same technical skills through the narrative course process; in addition, students may not use both technical credit and prior experiential credit to satisfy degree requirements.
- Students may not apply more than 36 hours of technical credit to a degree. However, the specific number of technical hours applicable to each University Studies track varies to account for required coursework. Students should discuss technical credit with an academic advisor in the Department of University Studies.
