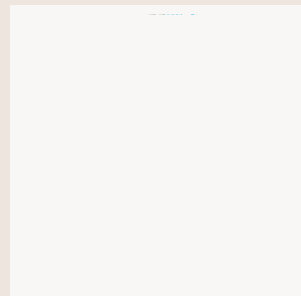

Previously PSA levels of 4.0 ng/mL or less were considered normal, but some individuals with PSA levels below 4.0 ng/mL have prostate cancer and many with higher PSA levels do not. For individuals ages 55 to 69 should discuss the potential benefits and harms of screening with their clinician. PSA-based screening for prostate cancer is not recommended for individuals 70 years and older.

Medicare provides coverage for an annual PSA test for all Medicare-eligible individuals ages 50 and older.

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
